Dissertation: "The Specter of Violence: Perceptions of Violence and Political Behavior in Mexico"

- Combined multiple methodologies to understand perceptions of violence and the effects on democratic engagement, generating a novel finding that overestimation of violence led to suppressed voter turnout, increased indecision, and support for unorthodox policies.
- Executed and analyzed an original survey of 17,500 Mexican voters which combined traditional questions with 7 different experimental designs to reveal underlying cognitive biases and perceptions.
- Conducted 15+ qualitative, in-depth interviews with politicians, NGO leaders, and policy makers.
- Developed a theoretical framework for understanding relevant patterns of cognitive biases and misperceptions grounded in sociology, evolutionary psychology, and behavioral economics.
- Presented key findings in engaging and accessible ways to academics via conference papers and research workshops and to non-technical audiences via public talks, guest lectures, and blog posts.
